


Figure S1 10x polarized light micrographs of 5wt% DBS in PEG200 crystallized in tripliciate. Scale bar = $100 \mu m$.




Figure S2 10× polarized light micrographs of 5wt% DBS in PEG600 crystallized in triplicate. Scale bar = 100 μm.




Figure S3 Scanning electron micrographs of 5wt% DBS in PEG200 crystallized on three separate SEM Spindles.




Figure S4 Scanning electron micrographs of 5wt% DBS in PEG600 crystallized on three separate SEM spindles.
