The prize:

- CHF 1000 (Swiss Francs);
- The option to publish one paper free of charge in *Crystals* after peer review before the end of 30 June 2023;
- An engraved plaque.

Eligibility and requirements:

- Must have got doctoral degree and be below 35 years of age;
- Must have produced ground-breaking research and provided a significant; contribution to the advancement of the research field;
- Candidates must be nominated by senior scientists.

List of documents for nomination:

- Detailed curriculum vitae including an updated publication list and a list of the researcher's own research grants;
- Birth certificate or other proof of age;
- Scanned copy of doctorate certificate;
- Signed nomination letters from two established senior scientists.

Schedule:

- Open for nominations: 1st January 2022
- Nomination deadline: 31st October 2022
- Winner announced: 30th November 2022
