Dear Colleagues,

The journal *Forests* (ISSN 1999-4907, https://www.mdpi.com/journal/forests) is inviting applications for the *Forests* 2021 Best Ph.D. Thesis Award. This prize will be awarded to two Ph.D. students who are about to graduate or participate in a graduation thesis. The applications will be assessed by an Evaluation Committee led by the Editors-in-Chief, Prof. Dr. Timothy A. Martin.

Eligibility Requirements:

- The candidate must be a Ph.D. student who is going to graduate or participate in graduation thesis defenses.
- The Ph.D. thesis must be original work.
- The Ph.D. thesis must be defended between 1 January 2021 and 31 December 2021.
- Applicants are required to submit the following documents:
 - An executive summary of the Ph.D. thesis in English, of around 3000 words;
 - A letter from the Ph.D. supervisor recommending the candidate for consideration for this award;
 - The candidate's CV, including a list of publications connected with the thesis;
 - An electronic copy of the Ph.D. thesis;
 - A scanned copy of the Ph.D. diploma (or certificate of studying at a school or research institute as a Ph.D. student going to graduate or participate in graduation thesis defenses).

Selection Criteria:

- Quality of resume and publications;
- Relevance of the candidate and research description;
- Novelty of the candidate's Ph.D. thesis;
- Strength of the recommendation letter;
- Anticipated academic potential;
- Originality and impact of the research.

Prizes:

- Bonus (CHF 500);
- Certificate;
- An offer to publish a featured paper in Forests with a 50% discount on the article processing charge (APC) before the end of 2023.
