The publisher of the *ISPRS International Journal of Geo-Information* (herein referred to as ‘the Journal’), MDPI AG and ESRI, have agreed to jointly present “The Jack Dangermond Award”^{*} to encourage and stimulate submission of high quality scientific papers by individual authors or groups to the Journal, to promote and advertise the Journal, and to honour the outstanding contributions of Jack Dangermond to research and development in Geospatial Sciences.

THE JACK DANGERMOND AWARD

FOR THE MOST OUTSTANDING PAPER

Regulations

The award, which consists of an ISPRS certificate and a grant of **USD 10,000**, will be presented every four years to the author(s) of an outstanding paper on one of the topics included in the scope of the Journal. The recipient(s) of the Jack Dangermond Award shall receive the award only once.

Candidates for the award shall be authors of a paper written in English, and published exclusively in the Journal during the four-year period from 1 January of a Congress year, to 31 December of the year prior to the next Congress (referred herein as ‘the evaluation period’). For multiple authored papers, the grant shall be split equally among the authors; certificate will be given to each.

Members of the Jury and the Editor-in-Chief shall not be eligible to receive the Jack Dangermond Award or ‘best paper’ award.

The Award shall be presented to the recipient(s) by the President of ISPRS and a representative of each sponsor at a plenary session of the Congress.
