Dr. Elisabeth Varga studies the production of fish killing prymnesin toxins produced by the haptophyte *Prymnesium parvum*, as well as karmitoxin produced by the dinoflagellate *Karlodinium armiger*. Her tasks include the preparative purification and identification of prymnesins by liquid chromatographic-mass spectrometric methods and she reveals the chemical diversity of these molecules.

Dr. Miklós Poór has a deep interest in toxicology and pharmacokinetics. His main research fields are mycotoxins, albumin-ligand interactions, and pharmacokinetic aspects of food-drug interactions.
